Transitions is a new-this-year exhibit in collaboration with Madera County Arts County. The show runs at Circle Gallery in Madera from 3/14 to 4/19, the reception is 5 - 7 pm on Thursday, 3/14/24. There were one hundred nineteen entries, 89 were accepted including some very large pieces that will be on display. \$1000 budgeted from YSA for prize money and payment for the judges. MCAC will take 30% of sales. We should have all our expenses covered. We don't know if this is a one-time show or a reoccurring show.

Au Naturale will be back at Oakhurst Spirits from 4/26 - 5/26. Submissions close 4/13. Reception is 4/27/24. Kerby will be the judge. There will be ribbons but no prize money.

• 53rd Anniversary Show

Kerby moved that we put off the 53rd anniversary show until next year. No one seconded, and discussion ensued about the pros and cons of this possibility. For some members, the anniversary show is the only time they show their work. Conclusion was that we need to ask members what they want and ask who can help with the organization of the show. Barbara has had a preliminary discussion with Jon Bock about using the Gallery 5 space for this show in June. If we are not doing this show, need to let Jon know right away.
